

Understand Your Classroom Conferencing Capabilities

Personalize Your Canvas User Profile



Now that so much teaching and learning is online, making personal connections with students requires intention. A good way to start is by personalizing your Canvas user profile. Your profile will be published across Canvas, so you won't have to recreate it for each course you teach. You can post your biography, your publications, and share links to your social media accounts, like Instagram or LinkedIn.

Also, note that you can now access all your Kaltura content in your Canvas User Profile!

Fall Semester, Coursera Online Courses Available at No Charge

All University of Minnesota students, instructors, and staff now have access to more than 3,800 open courses and 400 Coursera Specializations (collections of courses) at no cost for Fall 2020 Semester. Register by October 31 and complete by December 31, 2020. This high-quality, electronic curricular material consists of a series of modules with 8-12 minute video segments, readings, assessments, and assignments that can be used by instructors to supplement course content or can be taken independently by students, faculty, and staff.
