



Google and Canvas



Spotlight



All UMN Canvas courses now have access to a tool that can help create a more inclusive and equitable learning experience in Canvas. The Universal Design Online content Inspection Tool (UDoIT, pronounced "you do it") can scan Canvas course sites to identify and help correct accessibility issues. Learn how to access and use UDoIT.

Canvas integrates with Google Drive to let you create collaborations and build content. Plus it expands the options for students to submit assignments. But it's not 'one size fits all.' There are two methods of connecting Google Drive with Canvas. Depending on your needs, either, both, or only one may be suitable. The following articles will help you to select the right tool, enable it in your course, and address common pitfalls.
